
TRANSITION TEAM, AMAZING GRACE, DECEMBER, 2023


STREAMERS NEEDED FOR SUNDAY SERVICE VIDEO

I. Call to Order – Mark Smalley 6:15pm

Appointment of time keeper and start recording

II. Prayer and Devotions

C. Annual Ministry Reports are due to Vicky by December 31st Mark

Committee's need to get their reports in.

D. Historical preservation committee and a financial record storage space – Diane

Discussed forming a short-term committee to put everything in one room off the floor. It would be nice to have a historical library for the church.

E. Visitation

Discussed how to stay in contact with people who haven't been seen in church in a while and how to encourage people that they are free to contact Pastor for either a call or visitation.

VII. Ministry team reports: (30 min)

A. Outreach – Suzan

Sock and Underwear Sunday was changed to Undie Sunday. Collection baskets will be in the sanctuary and fellowship hall.

Food Bank- Joelle will contact Suzan about what the church needs to collect for the Christmas food baskets. Both food banks continue to need regular donations.

Cold Weather Supplies- There is no cold weather shelter currently. Suzan has been in contact with a representative from Chaplain's on the Harbor who let Suzan know that they are currently in need of propane and propane tanks for the tent encampment in Aberdeen. Suzan asked the council if this was something the church could provide. Suzan will get more information.

Good Gifts- Supplies have been ordered. Debby, Diane, and Suzan will put up and decorate the Good Gifts tree. Handmade ornaments will be made for the tree.

E.L.F. – pie auction went great. Money will go towards gift cards for local families who are struggling.

B. Worship – Sarah

Working on expanding the committee. A member brought up a concern to switch on how communion is done. In January there will be a meeting for those who help with ushering/greeting, communion assistance, altar guild, bread bakers and anyone one else to discuss the communion process.

L.A.T.- meeting on December 2nd to decorate for Advent.

C. Youth & Family – Michelle

Meet once a month. In November the kids decorated cut out turkey's and wrote messages on them and delivered them when they did the meals at Union Gospel. In December they will do the story "Joseph and the coat of many colors". The youth and families will be attending the matinee of "Joseph and the Technicolor

Dreamcoat" at the Driftwood theater on December 3. They will be able to attend thanks to an anonymous donor from the congregation. The kids love the family space in the sanctuary.

Sarah and Michelle are working on the children's Christmas program.

D. Fellowship – Lynette

- 1. Visitation ministry- Carmon Shaw, Michael Hildreth and Lynette Lile. Ministry met with Pastor Doug and worked out who's bringing communion to whom and when. Communion kits will be blessed on the first Sunday of the month.
- 2. Nov pie auction- The potluck and pie auction were well attended. The live auction raised over \$5,000. The silent auction will continue online until Friday and end of Sunday, Nov. 26 @ 11:30. Gary did an excellent

- 3. 60 more coloring books were printed, and some were offered at the auction with the suggestion of giving a donation. We may talk more about the t-shirts Mitchell's donated as they could be used for future fund raising.
- **4.** Christmas Caroling December 10th 3pm. Xander Johnstone will be providing the Chili.

E. Property – Mike

- 1. Organization of the Sanctuary basement
- 2. Counter tops- We are getting bids from ResCom and another firm associated with K and J design of Hoquiam. More to follow.
- 3. ResCom- Reinstalled the correct color carpet in a professional manner.
- **4.** Family Friendly Area- mostly complete. Pews are moved and attached to the floor. A table has been set up and is in use. Maintenance is in the process of putting in some softening material to absorb noise when things are dropped. ResCom gave a back bid of \$1000 to install an affixed carpet that could be put down and not damage the floor when removed later if we change back. It was also suggested that an area rug would work too for \$200 or less. Gravity would hold it in place and should be easy to care for. More to follow.

Motion to use \$300 from the general fund to buy carpet for the children's area in the sanctuary. M/S/P

Wish list for projects to work on in no specific order. Always looking for items to add to the list:

- 1. New carpet for sanctuary (either throughout or partial replacement)
- 2. Handrail backdoor steps of the parish hall.
- 3. Guard rail at the edge of the pit going into the church basement from the west end exterior entrance.
- **4.** Leak in the church basement in heavy rains and just the right conditions.
- 5. Continued maintenance on the wooden staircase from the parking lot and chasing water leaks as they appear.

Decided not to mount plagues for contribution to stained-glass window since the list of all who contributed is extensive and all who gave need to be recognized.
